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<u>SAFETY</u>

- 1. Read the operator's manual carefully and familiarize yourself with the proper use of your attachment. Do not allow anyone who is not acquainted with the Safety Instructions to use your attachment.
- 2. Know the controls and how to stop quickly. READ THE OPERATOR'S MANUAL!
- **3.** Do not allow children to operate the mower. Do not allow adults to operate the mower or grass collection system without proper instruction.
- 4. Be especially watchful of children and pets darting into the area while operating.
- **5.** Keep your eyes and mind on your unit while mowing or operating your attachment. Don't let others distract you.
- 6. Do not attempt to operate your unit or mower when not in the driver's seat.
- 7. Always stop unit when emptying the container.
- **8.** Stop unit, shut off deck attachment, set parking brake, shut off mower engine and remove spark plug wire before removing clogs, removing or replacing hose, boot, blower cone, or performing any maintenance.
- 9. If a slope must be ascended, back up the slope; drive forward when descending.
- **10.** It is recommended that the container be kept only half full when negotiating any slopes. Start mowing on slopes when the container is empty and never mow slopes greater than 15 degrees.
- **11.** Inspect your lawn and remove any foreign objects before mowing. Never deliberately run the mower across any foreign object.
- **12.** Wear ear protection if the noise level is offensive.
- **13.** Wear eye protection to prevent debris from damaging your eyes.

SAFETY

WARNING! NEVER operate the mower unless the discharge guard and either the deflector assembly or the vacuum collector adapter are fastened securely in place.

WARNING! Do not work around the mower deck boot or the blower area until you are certain that the mower blades and the blower impeller have stopped rotating.

WARNING! To avoid serious injury, perform maintenance on the vacuum collector; **ONLY AFTER STOPPING THE MOWER'S ENGINE AND WAITING FOR ALL MOVING PARTS TO COME TO A COMPLETE STOP.** Set the parking brake. Always remove the ignition key before beginning maintenance.

WARNING! For your own personal safety, **ALWAYS** back up the face of slopes. **NEVER** attempt to mow excessively steep slopes, and use caution when turning on any slope.

SECTION I INTRODUCTION AND DESCRIPTION

Introduction

We are pleased to have you as a PECO customer. Your collection system has been designed to give you a low maintenance, simple, and effective way to collect the grass clippings from your mower. This manual is provided to give you the necessary instructions to properly mount and operate the collection system on your mower. Please read this manual thoroughly. Understand what each control is for and how to use it. Observe all safety decal precautions on the machine and noted throughout the manual.

NOTE: all references made to right, left, front, rear, top or bottom are as viewed from the normal operator's position on the mower.

Description

The collection system is designed for turf maintenance where there is a need to collect the grass clippings as the mower cuts the turf. It is also good for picking up leaves and twigs in pre-season and post-season cleanup.

The engine/blower/blade assembly, is mounted on the right side of the unit. The blower draws grass clippings from the discharge area of the cutter deck up and back to the aluminum container mounted over the rear portion of the mower frame. The operator can engage the engine/blower/blade assembly by starting the engine. Once the container is full of clippings, the operator can easily pull and raise the lift handle. Using the lift handle, the operator releases the rear door, the container pivots towards the ground, and the clippings are dumped.




Section II INSTALLATION FOR USE Preparation Of Mower

Carefully dismantle wooden shipping crate from around the components. Cut retaining straps and separate the parts. The collection system will have various parts located inside. Remove and sort all parts for easy identification.

NOTE: Before each step of assembly it will help to study the exploded drawings.

Battery Cover Preparation


Modification to the plastic battery cover needs to be made to access battery when unit is fully assembled. Remove cover by loosening the two wing nuts on both sides of the cover and remove. Make a mark 1/8" above the turn upwards on all three of the tabs and cut, removing approximately 1/2" of material. Reattach cover and make sure that it will slide on and off without having to rotate outwards. See Figure A.



Rear Support Frame Installation

Note: It is recommended that someone assist you in attaching the rear support frame.


Lift the Rear Support Frame P#(A0862) into position aligning the mounting holes on the rear support frame with the existing holes on the rear bumper of the mower, as shown. Fasten the rear frame support using (4) 7/16"-14 x 1" HHCS P#(K1458) and (4) 7/16"-14 Flange Nuts P#(K1459). (See Figures B & C)



Box Support Frame Installation


Note: It is recommended that someone assist you in attaching the box support frame.

Lift the Box Support Frame P#(A0579) into position and align the mounting holes on the Box Support Frame with the mounting holes on the Rear Support Frame Assembly P#(A0862). Fasten the Box Support Frame using (2) 3/4"-10 x 1-1/2" HHCS P#(K0364) and (2) 3/4"-10 Ny- Locknuts P#(1433). Then, attach (2) Locking Handle Assemblies P#(J0012), 3/4" Flat Washers P#(K0061) and (2) 1/2"-13 x 1" HHCS P#(K1231). (See Figure A)



Frame Support Brace Installation

Position the Frame Support Brace P#(B0212) onto the rear side of the mower's ROPS and raise the Frame Support Brace into position with the pins on the Box Support Frame. Fasten using (2) 3/8"-16 x 3" U-Bolts P#(K1432) and (4) 3/8"-16 Ny-Flange Locknuts P#(K2038).




Right Side Mounting Holes



Box Assembly Installation

Note: It is recommended that two people assist you in mounting the box assembly.


Lift the Box Assembly into position onto the frame and align the box pivot holes with the mounting holes on the frame. Insert (2) Clevis Pins P#(K0172) from the outside of the box and fasten with (2) 5/8" Flat Washers P#(K0058) and (2) 5/32" x 2-5/8" Hair Pin Clips P#(K0088). See Figure C.




Hair Pin Clip

Attach the bottom ends of the door linkage rods to the frame with (2) Cotter Pins P#(K1437). If necessary, turn the adjusting screw to align the mounting holes. See Figure D for detail.




L Cotter Pin

Blower Cone Installation

Thread (1) 5/16"-18 Jam Nut P#(K0120) onto each end of (2) 5/16"-18 x 2-1/2" HHCS P#(K0125). Now partially thread the bolts into each of the two tabs located on the blower housing. Place blower cone so the two tabs line up with the bolts then tighten completely. See Figure A.




Impeller Blade Removal/Replacement

To Remove: First remove the Center Bolt (#1), Washer (#2) and Spacer (#3) from the Taper-Lock Bushing (#5). See Figure B. Next remove the (2) 1/4"-20 Bolts (#4) and place them into the threaded holes of the Taper-Lock bushing (next to the holes they were removed from). Gradually thread each bolt evenly into the Taper-Lock Bushing, forcing the blade to break-away from the Taper-Lock bushing. If the Impeller will not move, hit the base of the impeller, between each vein, with a hammer, then try again.

Dump Mechanism Adjustment


The linkage rods may be adjusted at the adjusting screw and at the latch assembly. To change the door closure tightness, thread the adjusting screw clockwise to loosen the contact between the door and the box, or counter-clockwise to tighten the contact between the door and the box.


To adjust the latch, change the length of the latch rod by threading the latch rod in or out of the adjusting ball joint. The latch hook pivot should be in the middle of the slot in the latch hook pivot plate. Slide the pivot back and forth, then tighten so the door opens and closes while still having a tight seal between the door and the box. See Figure A.



Box Inlet Installation


Insert the inlet P#(V0025C) into the opening from the inside out. From the outside of the box, place two Inlet Clamps P#(B0901) on each side of inlet and hold in place with (2) 5/16"-18 x 1" HHCS P#(K1154) and (2) 5/16" Flat Washers P#(K0042) on each clamp. Next, from the inside of the box place all (4) spacers P#(S0006) over bolts. Align the remaining (2) Inlet Clamps P#(B0901) with bolt holes having the same orientation as the others. Last, fasten with (4) 5/16"-18 Ny-Flange Locknuts P#(K2516). See Figure B.






Engine Mount Arm Installation

Slide the Engine Mount Arm assembly P#(A2022) behind the front right wheel and in front of the battery housing cover. Fasten the Engine Mount Arm assembly to the chassis using (1) 3/8"-16 x 1-1/4" Carriage Bolt P#(K1183) through the square hole, see figure C, and fasten with (1) 3/8"-16 Ny-Flange locknut P#(K2038). Next, place (2) 1/2"-13 x 4-5/16 x 2-3/4 U-Bolts P#(K0289) around frame and into holes on Mount plate and secure with (4) 1/2"-13 Ny-Flange locknuts P#(K2012).



Engine/Blower/Blade Assembly Installation

Before mounting engine place Rubber Pads (#V1090) between mount plate and base of engine. Align holes in rubber pads with holes on engine mount plate. Place the engine/blower/blade assembly onto the engine mount arm assembly and align the mounting holes. With rubber pads between engine and mount plate, fasten using (4) 5/16"-18 x 2-1/4" HHCS P#(K1160) and (4) 5/16"-18 Flange Locknuts P#(K2516). See Figure A on next page.




Assembly

Boot Installation

For 72" deck: Mount the Boot Plate P#(B1856) to the Boot P#(E1127) using (2) 3/8"-16 x 1" Carriage Bolts P#(K1182) and 3/8"-16 Flange Nuts P#(K1215). Make sure the head of the bolt is placed from inside the boot when fastening. This will prevent grass clippings from collecting on the bolts. Hang the Boot Plate onto the grass deflector rod.

For 60" deck: Mount the Boot Plate P#(B1815) to the Boot P#(E1127) using (2) 3/8"-16 x 1" Carriage Bolts P#(K1182) and 3/8"-16 Flange Nuts P#(K1215). To attach the Boot and Boot Plate lift the deflector shield and slide Boot Plate underneath the deflector rod. Figure B shows the Boot mounted to the 60" deck.




Length of Hose Adjustment IMPORTANT: PLACE GRASS COLLECTOR BOX IN UNLOAD/DUMP POSITION TO MEASURE HOSE CUT LENGTH.

The Upper and Lower Hoses must be cut to fit your machine. Follow the installation steps, but do not cut the hoses until you have tried to fit them on your machine. The hoses must be long enough to allow for clamping surface between the Inlet, Engine/Blower/Blade assembly, and the Boot.


Upper Hose Installation

Slide a 7" Hose Clamp P#(J0070) over both ends of the 7" upper hose. Slide one end of the hose onto the inlet. You will need about two inches of overlap between the hose end and the inlet. Slide the other end of the hose over the blower cone. Make sure both ends of the hose are clearly attached with enough overlap, then tighten the clamps. See Figure C




Lower Hose Installation To Blower Cone

Slide a 9" Hose Clamp P#(J0090) over both ends of the Lower Hose. Then proceed to slide the Lower Hose onto the Blower Cone. Tighten the Hose Clamp. The assembly should look like Figure D.



Lower Hose To Boot Installation

Take the unattached end of the Lower Hose and slide it over the circular end of the Boot. Use the Lower Hose Clamp to secure the hose to the Boot (Figure E).




Throttle Kit Assembly Installation

To install the throttle kit assembly to the ROPS (roll over protection system), place the 3/8" U-Bolt P#(K0136) onto the ROPS with the threads facing the front of the mower.

Next slide on the throttle mount plate assembly P#(A0666) with the rivets also facing toward the front of the mower. Tighten the throttle mount plate assembly securely to the ROPS using (2) 3/8"16 Ny-Flange Locknuts P#(K2038) (Figure A).

With the throttle cable facing toward the engine/blower/blade assembly, place the throttle base plate over the rivets, Slide the throttle cable kit to the right, moving the smaller end of the slot over the rivets. When positioned correctly, the throttle spring plate will snap into place (Figure B).

To remove the throttle cable kit, lift the throttle spring plate and slide the throttle kit to the left.



Throttle Kit Assembly Installation (Continued)

BR 10HP Vanguard

To fasten the throttle cable end to the engine, place the throttle control lever into the "slow" position. Rotate the engine throttle lever to the "slow" position.

Remove the screw on the engine next to the "fast" position of the throttle lever. Attach (1) Throttle Cable Sleeve Clamp, oriented with bent tab up and facing the engine, using the $10-32 \times 3/4$ " HHCS provided in the engine hardware. Insert the "Z" bend into the hole in the throttle lever. Clamp the throttle cable sleeve to the engine and tighten. Refer to the Figure A below.


Rotate the throttle control lever into the "fast" position to check for proper installation.

Yanmar 7HP

To fasten the throttle cable end to the engine, locate the throttle cable guide and receiver on the front of the engine. Refer to Figure B below.

Remove the clamp screw on the throttle cable receiver. Insert the throttle cable in through the top side of the throttle cable guide down into the hole located on top of the throttle cable receiver. Replace the clamp screw and tighten. Refer to Figure B below.

Rotate the throttle control lever to check for proper installation.



Wiring Kit Assembly Installation


To connect the Wiring Kit (P#:A2152), connect the (P#:P0620) 4 gage Red Wire to the positive (+) terminal of the starter solenoid on the engine. Route the Red Wire from the solenoid to the positive (+) terminal of the battery.

Connect the (P#:P0621) 8 gage Black Wire to one of the mounting bolt holes located on the bottom of the engine. Route the black wire from the bolt hole to the negative (-) terminal of the battery.




7HP Yanmar

SECTION III OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

General Safety

Only qualified people familiar with this operator's manual and the mower's operator's manual should operate this machine.

Operation & Tips On Mowing

- A. Perform BEFORE EACH USE maintenance.
- B. Start the engine/blower/blade assembly.
- B. Start mower.
- C. With the mower at high idle speed, engage the mower deck.
- D. Proceed to operate the control levers of the mower.

Note: If the collection system does not appear to be collecting the grass clippings; disengage the deck, and blower, engage the parking brake and turn the mower off. Check the upper hose, lower hose, top screen and boot for clogs.

To obtain the maximum effectiveness from your collection system the tips listed below should be followed:

- * Watch your speed- Normal conditions will allow a speed of up to approximately 5 mph, but thick, heavy damp conditions will require reduced ground speed.
- * Mow with sharp blades- A sharp blade cuts cleaner.
- * Wet grass and leaves will decrease effectiveness and will increase horsepower requirements.
- * Mow at higher cutting heights- Remove and mulch no more than 2" of grass length with each mowing.
 (Experts recommend not cutting off more than 1/3 of the grass blade length at any given time.)
- * Mow twice, at different height settings, (high, then low), if grass is extra tall.
- * Remember that horsepower requirements will vary with the mowing conditions such as type and height of turf grass, moisture content, amount of leaves, whether the terrain is flat or hilly, etc.

Unloading The Collection System

Note: Press the tab, located behind the operator's left side, downward to feel if the collection system is full. If the container is full there will be resistance when depressing the tab.

- A. Stop the forward movement of the mower.
- B. Disengage the mower deck.
- C. Using the throttle cable slow the engine down to idle.
- D. Push the dump handle, on the left of the operator, away from the unit. While holding the handle pushed away, move the handle upward. The container door will swing upward and the container will rotate downward. The container will release its contents.
- E. Once the contents of the container have fallen out, the container is ready to move back into its normal operating position. With the handle in the 'away' position, pull the handle downward until it stops. Move the handle towards the center of the mower. This motion will allow the latch to lock back into collection position.

Note: If you do not hold the handle away from the mower as you pull the handle downward, the latch will not lock and the container can unexpectedly release the contents collected.

SECTION IV MAINTENANCE

Maintenance Checklist

Before each use:

- 1. Check blades and spindles to be sure that no foreign objects, such as wire or steel strapping bands, are wrapped around them.
- 2. Inspect blades for wear. Replace if necessary. If it is necessary to sharpen the blades, remove the blades from the spindles before sharpening. DO NOT sharpen blades while still attached to the mower.
- Make sure all shields are in place and in good condition. Repair or replace any missing or damaged shields.
- 4. Listen for abnormal sounds, which might indicate loose parts, damaged bearings, or other damage. Correct any deficiency before continuing operation.
- Check for wear or deterioration of the upper or lower hoses. If there are any portions of the hose that have been torn or worn through, replace with genuine PECO parts.

After Each Use:

- 1. Clean all debris from machine especially from the container, and off of safety decals. Replace any missing or illegible decals.
- 2. Clean all debris from the box screen.
- Inspect unit for worn or damaged components. Repair or replace before the next use. Any replacement component installed during repair shall include the components current safety decal specified by the manufacturers to be affixed to the component.
