SAFETY

- **1.** Read the operator's manual carefully and familiarize yourself with the proper use of your attachment. Do not allow anyone who is not acquainted with the Safety Instructions to use your attachment.
- 2. Know the controls and how to stop quickly. READ THE OPERATOR'S MANUAL!
- **3.** Do not allow children to operate the mower. Do not allow adults to operate the mower or grass collection system without proper instruction.
- **4.** Be especially watchful of children and pets darting into the area while operating.
- 5. Keep your eyes and mind on your unit while mowing or operating your attachment. Don't let others distract you.
- **6.** Do not attempt to operate your unit or mower when not in the driver's seat.
- 7. Always stop unit when emptying the container.

CECTION

- **8.** Stop unit, shut off deck attachment, set parking brake, shut off mower engine and remove spark plug wire before removing clogs, removing or replacing hose, boot, blower cone, or performing any maintenance.
- 9. If a slope must be ascended, back up the slope; drive forward when descending.
- **10.** It is recommended that the container be kept only half full when negotiating any slopes. Start mowing on slopes when the container is empty and never mow slopes greater than 15 degrees.
- **11.** Inspect your lawn and remove any foreign objects before mowing. Never deliberately run the mower across any foreign object.
- **12.** Wear ear protection if the noise level is offensive.
- **13.** Wear eye protection to prevent debris from damaging your eyes.

SAFETY

WARNING! NEVER operate the mower unless the discharge guard and either the deflector assembly or the vacuum collector adapter are fastened securely in place.

WARNING! Do not work around the mower deck boot or the blower area until you are certain that the mower blades and the blower impeller have stopped rotating.

WARNING! To avoid serious injury, perform maintenance on the vacuum collector; **ONLY AFTER STOPPING THE MOWER'S ENGINE AND WAITING FOR ALL MOVING PARTS TO COME TO A COMPLETE STOP.** Set the parking brake. Always remove the ignition key before beginning maintenance.

WARNING! For your own personal safety, **ALWAYS** back up the face of slopes. **NEVER** attempt to mow excessively steep slopes, and use caution when turning on any slope.

Section I INTRODUCTION & DESCRIPTION

1-1 Introduction

Your grass collection system has been designed to give you a low maintenance, simple, and effective way to collect the grass clippings from your mower. This manual is provided to give you the necessary instructions to properly mount and operate the collection system on your mower. Please read this manual thoroughly. Understand what each control is for and how to use it. Observe all safety decal precautions on the machine and noted throughout the manual.

NOTE: all references made to right, left, front, rear, top or bottom are as viewed from the normal operator's position on the mower.

1-2 Description

The grass collection system is designed for turf maintenance where there is a need to collect the grass clippings as the mower cuts the turf. It is also used for picking up leaves in pre-season and post-season cleanup.

The blower, mounted on the right side of the unit, uses a belt and gearbox system from the engine PTO shaft. Drive train protection comes through belt slippage. The blower draws grass clippings from the discharge area of the cutting deck back to the (2) - 2.9 cubic foot collection bags P#(G0004) at the rear portion of the mower frame. The operator can engage the blower with a spring-lock engagement handle on the right side of the unit. Once the bags are full with clippings, they can be released to make for easy dumping.

Section II INSTALLATION FOR USE

2-1 Preparation Of Mower


Carefully open the shipping box. The grass collection system will have various parts located inside. Remove and sort all parts for easy identification. Verify all parts against the list on page 5. If parts are missing, please contact PECO Inc. at (800) 438-5823.


NOTE: Study all drawings and exploded views on pages 16 thru 19 before starting assembly.

From the underside of the engine, remove the bolt and bushing from the electric clutch assembly. Use a bungee cord or similar device to hold the clutch in place while the hardware is removed.

Replace the hardware removed with the engine pulley assembly P#(A0698). Fasten the engine pulley to the electric clutch assembly using (1) 7/16" hi-collar helical spring lock washer P#(K0140) and (1) 7/16"-20 x 2-3/4" HHCS P#(K0379). See Figure 2-1a and 2-1b for details.

The added pulley will power the collection system. Torque the bolt to 55 ft./lbs.





Removing The Rear Bumper Guard

Remove the four existing nuts and hex bolts that fasten the rear bumper guard to the rear frame of the mower. Set aside. This guard will be used in the next step. See Figure 2-1c.




Remove Existing Hardware and Rear Guard Plate

2-2 Lower Mount Tube Installation

Align the holes in the lower mount tube assembly P# (A1720) with the holes on rear frame. Replace rear guard plate on top of lower mount tube assembly and fasten with (2) 3/8"-16 x 1-1/4" HHCS P#(K1192) and (2) 3/8"-16 nyloc nuts P#(K1216) on each side. Tighten hardware. See Figure 2-2a thru 2-2c.




2-3 Lower Mount Clamp Bracket Installation

Mount the lower mount clamp bracket P#(B0302) to the lower mount tube assembly P#(A1720) and the tractor rear guard. The bracket secures the tube to the tractor rear frame. The bracket's bend should be placed to the inside of the rear frame edge. Place (1) 3/8"- $16 \times 2-1/4$ " x 2-5/8" U-bolt P#(K1119) from the tube side. Secure with (2) 3/8"- $16 \times 2-1/4$ " number of the rear frame edge. Place (1) 3/8"- $16 \times 2-1/4$ " x 2- $16 \times 2-1/4$ "







2-4 PTO Mount Plate Assembly Installation





Figure 2-15d Right Side

Place the PTO mount plate assembly P#(A0670) onto the right rear chassis of the mower, lining up the lower set of holes with the top and bottom slots in the rear chassis of the mower. See Figure 2-4a for PTO hole pattern. Fasten the assembly by inserting (4) 3/8"-16 x 1-1/4" HHCS P#(K1192) through the PTO mount plate assembly and the slots in the rear chassis (Figure 2-4b), then place (2) PTO mount clamp plates P#(B0321) onto the chassis from the inside and align holes with bolts and secure by using (4) 3/8"-16 nyloc nuts P#(K1216). See Figure 2-4c.


2-5 Universal PTO Installation

To mount the PTO assembly, insert the mount rod on the PTO assembly P#(A0623) into the mounting slots located on the PTO mount plate assembly P#(A0670). Next, tilt the PTO assembly forward and insert the PTO assembly mount pin P#(B0274) thru the hole in the top of the PTO mount plate assembly and thru the PTO assembly. Secure the PTO mount pin using (1) 1/8" x 2-1/2" hair pin clip P#(K0086). Refer to Figure 2-5a and Figure 2-5b.



2-6 Belt Installation/Removal and Adjustment

Remove the (4) 1/4"-20 x 1/2" P#(K0353) HHSTS from the belt guard located on the bottom of the PTO assembly as shown in Figure 2-6a and 2-6b. Loosen the (2) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" HHCS P#(K1153) that secure the gear box assembly to the PTO assembly P#(A1041) (Figure 2-6c). Loosen the adjustment bolt (1) 3/8"-16 x 2" HHCS P#(K0348) until the gear box assembly is at its far left adjustment (the gear box is moved toward the mower's engine pulley). Connect the kevlar cord belt A62K P#(M0251) from the engine pulley to the lower gear box pulley (Figure 2-6d.). To tension the drive belt, turn the adjustment bolt clockwise (Figure 2-6c.) until there is 1" of deflection, with 10-11 lbs. of pressure, at the center of the belt between the engine pulley and the gear box pulley. Once the correct tension of the belt is achieved, tighten the (2) bolts that secure the gear box assembly.




2-7 Cam Assembly Adjustment


The cam assembly, which controls the blower belt tension, comes from the factory pre-adjusted. If the belt is too tight or becomes too loose, remove the hair pin clip from the belt tension rod and pull the "L" end of the rod out of it's hole in the cam assembly. The tension rod may then be screwed out to tighten the belt or screwed in to loosen the belt. Replace the "L" end into the top hole in the cam and replace the hair pin clip. Adjust the cam stop bolt to allow the cam to rotate slightly over center when the blower is engaged (Figure 2-7a).



2-8 PTO Handle Installation


Mount the PTO handle P#(A0626) to the PTO assembly using (3) 1/4"-20 x 3/4" HHCS P#(K1222) and (3) 1/4"-20 nyloc nuts P#(K1128). Refer to Figure 2-8a and 2-8b.





2-9 Blower Cone Installation

Thread (1) 5/16"-18 jam nut P#(K0120) onto each end of (2) 5/16"-18 x 2-1/2" HHCS P#(K0125). Now partially thread the bolts into each of the two tabs located on the blower housing. Place blower cone so the two tabs line up with the bolts then tighten completely. When the (2) 5/16"-18 x 2-1/2" HHCS are tightened, tighten the (2) jam nuts onto the blower housing tabs. See Figure 2-9a.




2-10 Impeller Blade Removal/Replacement



To Remove: First remove the center bolt (#1), washer (#2) and spacer (#3) from the taper-lock bushing (#5). See Figure 2-10a. Next remove the (2) 1/4"-20 bolts (#4) and place them into the threaded holes of the taper-lock bushing (next to the holes they were removed from). Gradually thread each bolt evenly into the taper-lock bushing, forcing the blade to break-away from the taper-lock bushing. If the impeller will not move, hit the base of the impeller, between each vein, with a hammer, then try again.

To Replace: Place impeller blade over the engine shaft. Slide the taper-lock bushing on to the engine shaft and into the impeller blade, aligning the non-threaded holes of the taper-lock bushing to the threaded holes of the impeller blade. Fasten by using (2) 1/4"-20 HHCS grade #8 bolts, (1) spacer washer and (1) HHCS bolt w/ washer. Torque to the proper specifications in the torque chart on the back of this manual. Next, rotate the impeller blade to insure that the blade is clear of contact on all sides of the blower housing.

2-11 Upper Frame Assembly Installation

NOTE: During this step, it is suggested that two people install the upper frame to the lower mount tube.

Using (2) people to lift the upper frame P#(A0585), lift the upper frame above the lower mount assembly P#(A1720) making sure the frame is pointing away from the mower (Figure 2-11a). Slide the upper frame tube into the lower mount assembly and align holes. Secure with (1) clevis pin P#(K0133) and (1) hair pin clip P#(K0088). Refer to Figure 2-11b

2-12 Top Assembly To Upper Frame Assembly Installation

Align the pivot brackets of the top assembly P#(A0551) to the pivot point on either side of the upper frame assembly. Place (1) fender washer P#(K0041) between each pivot point per side and fasten each side by using (1) P#(K1153) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" HHCS and (1) P#(K1180) 5/16"-18 nyloc nut. When fastening leave nut slightly loose so that the top can pivot freely. Refer to Figure 2-12a.






2-13 Inlet Installation

With the top assembly P#(A0551) in the upright position, insert the inlet P#(V1054) into the right hand hole in the top assembly as shown in Figure 2-13a. Continue to insert the inlet until it snap locks into place. The inlet should now pivot freely about the hole.



2-14 Boot To Mower Deck Installation

Remove the handle grip screw bolt from the grass deflector and set aside. The handle grip will be used to mount the boot plate in the next step. Remove the existing grass deflector from the mower deck (Figure 2-14a).


60" Deck Instructions:

Mount the boot plate P#(A1718) to the boot **P#(E0016)** for 60" decks or P#(E2419) for 54" decks. Fasten boot to plate using (3) 3/8"-16 x 1" carriage bolts P#(K1182) and (3) 3/8"-16 nyloc nuts P#(K1216). Make certain that when bolting the boot and boot plate together, that the head of the bolt is placed from the inside of the boot. This will prevent grass from collecting on bolts.

Existing Grass Deflector


Attach the (1) boot plate mount pin P#(B0284) with (1) 3/8"-16 x 3/4" HHCS bolt and (1) 3/8"-16 lock washer P#(K0048). Insert the boot plate mount pin into the existing hole on the mower deck and fasten the boot plate to the mower deck using the handle grip screw bolt as shown in Figure 2-14b.


2-15 Front Weight Assembly

When installing the weight you should have another person help position the weight or use a jack to hold the weight in place until fastened. The weight will be attached using weight brackets (2) P#(B0317) and (2) weight bracket mounts P#(B0318) on the left and right side of the front frame bar on mower. See Figure 2-15a for part identification.



2-15 Front Weight Assembly Cont...

Locate the front frame bar of mower. On each side of the front frame there is a tab on each side with an existing oblong slot. The left and right brackets (2) P#(B0317) are to be mounted to the inside of tab and the (2) bracket mounts are to be mounted on the outside of tab. See Figure 2-15b and 2-15c.



Mount the brackets to each side using (2) 3/8"-16 x 1-1/4" HHCS bolts P#(K1192) and (2) 3/8"-16 nyloc nuts P#(K1216) per side. The bolt should enter from the outside of tab. See Figure 2-15c thru 2-15e.



Once the brackets are mounted and hardware tightened, mount the weight to the front of the brackets using (1) 1/2"-13 x 4-5/16 x 4-1/4" U-bolts P#(K0331) and (2) 1/2"-13 nyloc nuts P#(K1247) per side. The bolt should enter from the outside of weight. Another person should help with the weight or use a jack to hold weight in place until secure. See Figure 2-15f.



2-16 Length Of Hose Adjustment

The hoses in steps 2-17 and 2-18 must be cut to fit your machine. Do not cut the hoses until you have tried to fit them on your machine. Remember that the hoses have to be long enough to adjust for the blower assembly's movement as well as allow for enough clamping surface between the inlet, blower assembly and the deck boot.

2-17 Upper Hose Installation

Slide a hose clamp P#(J1000) over both ends of the upper hose. Then slide one end of the upper hose onto the inlet. Make sure there is about a two-inch overlap between the hose end and the container inlet. Proceed to slide the opposite end of the upper hose onto the outlet of the blower assembly. See Figure 2-16 for details. Tighten the hose clamps.

2-18 Lower Hose To Blower Cone Installation


Slide a upper hose clamp P#(J1000) over both ends of the 6" lower hose. Then proceed to slide the lower hose onto the blower cone. Tighten the hose clamp. See Figure 2-15 for details.

2-19 Lower Hose To Boot Installation

Take the unattached end of the lower hose and slide it over the circular end of the boot. Use the hose clamp P#(J1000) to secure the hose to the boot.

NOTE: Before tightening the hose clamp, rotate the lower hose counter clockwise (see Figure 2-15) approximately 1" and then tighten the clamp. This will hold the bottom edge of the boot tight to the mower deck.

2-20 Installation/Removal Of Collection Bags


To install the bag onto the bag ring, first make sure the bag ring end caps are fastened to the bag ring. Place the seam openings of the bag onto the bag ring openings and turn the bag until the slot bracket in the bag ring is protruding from the opening in the bag (Figure 2-20a). Do this for each of three bags.

Install the completed assemblies onto the support frame and close the plastic top. Fasten both draw latches to hold the plastic top closed (Figure 2-20b).

To empty the bag, remove the bag and bag ring by lifting and sliding rearward. Grasp the loop on the bottom of the bag, turn it upside down and empty the collected debris (Figure 2-20c). Repeat for the other bags. Reinstall all bags, line with plastic bags if desired, close the plastic top and reattach the draw latches.

Plastic lawn and leaf bags, 33 gallon size, may be used inside the cloth bags. Be sure to leave enough plastic bag hanging over the frame so the plastic bags can be twist tied before emptying (Figure 2-20d).

SECTION III OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

3-1 General Safety

Only qualified people familiar with this operator's manual and the mower's operator's manual should operate this machine.

3-2 Operation And Tips On Mowing

- A. Perform BEFORE EACH USE the maintenance list in paragraph 4-1.
- B. Start mower.
- C. With the mower at high idle speed, engage the mower deck.
- D. While seated in the operator's seat, pull the engagement handle of the PTO assembly towards the operator's seat until the handle slides into position in the retaining slot. With the PTO assembly engaged, you can proceed to operate the control levers of the mower.

NOTE: If the collection system does not appear to be collecting the grass clippings, disengage the deck and PTO assembly (Section 3-3), then, engage the parking brake and turn the mower off. Check upper and lower hoses for any clogs.

To obtain the maximum effectiveness from your collection system, the tips listed below should be followed:

- * Watch your speed- Normal conditions will allow a speed of up to approximately 4 mph, but thick, heavy damp conditions will require reduced ground speed.
- * Mow with sharp blades- A sharp blade cuts cleaner.
- * Wet grass and leaves will decrease effectiveness and will increase horsepower requirements.
- * Mow at higher cutting heights- Remove and mulch no more than 2" of grass length with each mowing. (Experts recommend not cutting off more than 1/3 of the grass blade length at any given time.)
- * Mow twice, at different height settings, (high, then low), if grass is extra tall.
- * Remember that horsepower requirements will vary with the mowing conditions such as type and height of turf grass, moisture content, amount of leaves, whether the terrain is flat or hilly, etc.

3-3 Disengagement Of The PTO Assembly

A. To disengage the PTO assembly, slide the engagement handle out of the retaining slot and push the engagement handle away from the operator's seat.

WARNING: The PTO assembly blades will continue to spin. DO NOT TOUCH the PTO assembly, pulleys, or the belt until the tractor is turned off. DO NOT adjust the belt tension until the mower is turned off. Refer to section 2-4 of the manual.

3-4 Unloading The Collection System

NOTE: To determine when the collection bags are full, follow the following steps:

- A. Stop the forward movement of the mower.
- B. Disengage the mower deck.
- C. Disengage the PTO assembly.
- D. Engage the parking brake.
- E. Once the parking brake has been engaged, then and only then, walk behind the mower and check the collection bags by first unhooking the rubber strap with S hook that secures the plastic top, then lift the plastic hood. Load in bags should not exceed the height of the installed bag.
- F. To remove the bags from the frame slide bags out and turn bags over to deposit clippings.
- G. Slide empty bags back onto the frame and secure plastic top with the rubber strap with 'S' hook.

NOTE: Do not allow collection bags to become overfilled as potential damage may occur to your equipment. Also, be sure to clean the hood screen as needed.

SECTION IV MAINTENANCE

4-1 Maintenance Checklist

Before each use:

- Check blades and spindles to be sure that no foreign objects, such as wire or steel strapping bands, are wrapped around them.
- 2. Inspect blades for wear. Replace if necessary. If it is necessary to sharpen the blades, remove the blades from the spindles before sharpening. DO NOT sharpen blades while still attached to the mower.

- Make sure all shields are in place and in good condition. Repair or replace any missing or damaged shields.
- 4. Perform lubrication per paragraph 4-2.
- 5. Listen for abnormal sounds, which might indicate loose parts, damaged bearings, or other damage. Correct any deficiency before continuing operation.
- With the engine off, engage the blower assembly. Check the belt tension and inspect the pulley belt for cracks or tears.
- 7. Check for wear or deterioration of the upper or lower hoses. If there are any portions of the hose that have been torn or worn through, replace immediately.

After Each Use:

- 1. Clean all debris from machine especially from the container, underneath the belt shields, and safety decals. Replace any missing or illegible decals.
- Inspect the unit for worn or damaged components.
 Repair or replace before the next use. Any
 replacement component installed during repair shall
 include the component's current safety decal specified
 by the manufacturers to be affixed to the component.
- 3. Check belt for proper tension.

4-2 Lubrication

NOTE: Use only white lithium based grease for lubrication of the shaft on the blower assembly.

- 1. On initial use: Grease the fitting on the blower shaft.
- 2. Every 25 hours of use: Re-grease the grease fitting.
- Every 200 hours of use: Check oil levels in gear box.
 Oil in gear box should cover the gears. If not, fill using an EP90 weight oil. 6oz. will fill the gear box from empty.

SECTION V PARTS AND SERVICE

5-1 Parts And Service Information






