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Section I - INTRODUCTION AND DESCRIPTION

Introduction

We are pleased to have you as a PECO customer. Your collection system has been designed to give you a low maintenance, simple, and effective way to collect the grass clippings from your mower. The manuals are provided to give you the necessary instructions to properly mount, operate and maintain the collection system on your mower. Please read this manual thoroughly. Understand what each control is for and how to use it. Observe all safety decal precautions on the machine and noted throughout the manual.

NOTE: All references made to right, left, front, rear, top or bottom are as viewed from the normal operator's position on the mower.

Description

The grass collection system is designed for turf maintenance where there is a need to collect the grass clippings as the mower cuts the turf. It is also used for picking up leaves in pre-season and post-season cleanup. The engine/blower/blade assembly, is mounted on the right side of the unit. The blower draws grass clippings from the discharge area up and back to the container mounted to the rear of the mower. The operator can engage the engine/blower/blade assembly by starting the engine. Once the container is full of clippings, the operator can then release the door latch and easily lift the handle to dump.



<u>Note</u>

Installations for specific units will be specified under the current section heading as either:

Estate Series Unit Instructions or Pasture Vac Unit Instructions

Pasture Vac Units may also share similar instructions with the Estate Series Units. The units sharing the same instructions will not have any specification under the section heading.

Section II - INSTALLATION FOR USE

Tilt Base Frame Assembly Installation

To install the Tilt Base Frame Assembly (Item #2), position the Tilt Base Frame Assy between the Chassis Frame Assembly (Item #1) and use (1) Tilt Rod (Item #3) to mount the Tilt Base Frame Assy. Secure the Tilt Rod by using (1) 3/4" Flat Washer (Item #4) and (1) Cotter Pin (Item #5) on each side of the Tilt Rod. Refer to Figure A below.

Note: Some parts and part features have been hidden from view for visual clarity.



Wheel Installation

To install the (2) Wheels (Item #2), lift the Chassis Frame Assy (Item #1) up enough to place and position the (2) Wheels onto either side of the axle of the Chassis Frame Assy. Secure each Wheel by using (1) 5/8"-11 x 1-1/4" HHCS (Item #3) and (1) 5/8" Flat Washer (Item #4) per Wheel. Refer to Figure B below.



Latch Assembly Installation

Before installing the Latch Assembly (Item #3), position the (2) Bearing Block / Sets (Item #2) over the Latch Assy and make sure the Bearing Block / Sets are set between and resting on the washers of the Latch Assy, refer to Figure B. Position the pre-assembled parts under the Tilt Base Frame Assembly (Item #1) aligning the bolt holes of the Bearing Block / Sets to those of the Tilt Base Frame Assy, Refer to Figure A and Figure C.

Secure all parts by using (2) 3/8"-16 x 2" Carriage Bolts (Item #4) and (2) 3/8"-16 Flange Nuts (Item #5) per Bearing Block / Set. Refer to Figure A.



Box Bottom & Front Panel Installation

Set the Bottom Panel (Item #2) onto the Tilt Base Frame Assembly (Item #1) aligning the mount holes of the Bottom Panel to those of the Tilt Base Frame Assy, refer to Figure A. Next, Position the Front Panel (Item #3) upright and on top of the Bottom Panel. Align the bottom front set of mount holes of the Front Panel to those on the Bottom Panel, refer to Figure B.

Loosely secure the Front Panel by using (4) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" Carriage Bolts (Item #4) and (4) 5/16"-18 Flange Nuts (Item #5), refer to Figure B. Keep hardware relatively loose for the next step.



Box Side Panel Installation

Place (1) Box Side Panel (Item #4) on either side of the Front Panel (Item #3). Make sure the Side Panel is on the inside of the Front Panel and Bottom Panel (Item #2). Align all mount holes of these parts.

When securing the right Side Panel along the upright side with the Front Panel, use (3) 5/16"-18 x 1/2" HHCS (Item #8) and (3) 5/16"-18 Flange Nuts (Item #7). Along the bottom, use (3) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" Carriage Bolts (Item #6) and (3) 5/16"-18 Flange Nuts. Refer to Figure A. Be sure to secure the Side Panel relatively loose.

When securing the left Side Panel, utilize the same hardware to secure the bottom side. Before securing the upright side, attach (1) Handle Rail Assembly (Item #5) and then secure the left side by using (2) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" Carriage Bolts (Item #6), (1) 5/16"-18 x 1/2" HHCS (Item #8) and (3) 5/16"-18 Flange Nuts (Item #7). Refer to Figure A. Be sure all hardware are relatively loose for the next step.



Vertical Rail Assembly Installation

Position the Right Vertical Rail Assembly (Item #2) onto the right Side Panel aligning all bolt holes to those of the Side Panel. For this step, the top (2) bolt holes will remain open and not use any hardware.

Secure the Right Vertical Rail Assy relatively loose by using (3) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" Carriage Bolt (Item #3) and (3) 5/16"-18 Flange Nut (Item #5) on the middle (3) bolt holes. Then use (1) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" HHCS (Item #4) and (1) 5/16"-18 Flange Nut (Item #5) on the lower bolt hole. Refer to Figure A.

Repeat the same procedure for the Left Vertical Rail Assembly (Item #1). Make sure all hardware are secured relatively loose.

Diagonal Rail Installation

Position the Diagonal Rail (Item #1) over the Vertical Rail Assembly and Side Panel aligning the bolt holes of these parts. Refer to Figure A.

Secure the Diagonal Rail relatively loose by using (2) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" Carriage Bolts (Item #2) on the top and bottom Rail, (2) 5/16"-18 x 1" Carriage Bolts (Item #3) on the middle of the rail and (4) 5/16"-18 Flange Nuts (Item #4). Refer to Figure A.

Repeat the same procedure for the other side. Make sure all hardware are secured relatively loose.

Screen Frame Assembly Installation

Remove the (2) 5/16"-18 x 1" Carriage Bolt (Item #2) and (2) 5/16"-18 Flange Nuts (Item #3) that were used to secure the top of the (2) Diagonal Rails from the previous step. Once removed, position the Screen Frame Assembly (Item #3) towards the rear aligning the rear (2) mount holes to the mount holes of the Diagonal Rail. Secure the Screen Frame Assy relatively loose by using the previously removed hardware along with an additional (2) 5/16"-18 x 1" Carriage Bolt, (2) 5/16"-18 Flange Nuts, (4) 1/4"-20 x 5/8" Carriage Bolts (Item #4) and (4) 1/4"-20 Flange Nuts (Item #5), refer to Figure A.

Box Top Panel Installation

Start by attaching (14) Small Tinnerman Clips (Item #5) along the tops of the Side Panels and Front Panel, see Figure A. Then set (4) Large Tinnerman Clips (Item #6) along the front edge of the Screen Frame Assy as shown in Figure B.

Secure the Top Panel A (Item #1) over the Front Panel and Side Panel by using (8) Tinnerman Screws (Item #4) along the sides of the Top Panel A. Then, set the Top Panel B (Item #2) on top of the Top Panel A aligning the front mount holes to the rear mount holes of Top Panel A. Secure the Top Panel B by using (6) #10-12 x 1/2" Tinnerman Screws along the sides and (4) #10-12 x 3/4" Tinnerman Screws (Item #3) on top securing both Top Panels to the Screen Frame Assy. Refer to Figure A.

Tighten all hardware at this time.



Inlet Cone Installation

Position the Inlet Cone (Item #2) over the collection hole of the Front Panel (Item #1) and secure the Inlet Cone by using (3) Blunt Tip Screw (Item #3) and (3) Flat Tinnerman Nuts (Item #4).

Door & Hinge Assembly Installation

Position Door & Hinge Assy (Item #1) back behind the trailer, see Figure A. Align the Door Hinge and insert the Door Hinge into the tabs of the Vertical Rails of both sides. See Figure B.



Door Tension Rod Assembly Installation

Slide the Door Tension Rod Assembly (Item #2) in through the Angle Support Bracket of the lower side of the trailer assembly, refer to Figure B. Next, install (1) Pivot Rod Strap (Item #3) onto the Door Tension Rod Assemblies (Item #2) by pre-threading (1) 1/2"-13 Flange Nut (Item #6) onto the Door Tension Rod. Then Secure the Pivot Rod Strap by first aligning the Pivot Rod Strap to the Door & Hinge Assembly (Item #1) and using (1) more 1/2"-13 Flange Nut on the top side of the Pivot Rod Strap. See Figure A.

Secure the Pivot Rod Strap to the Door & Hinge Assy using the Hinge of the Door Assy, see Figure C, and using (1) 1/2" Flat Washer (Item #5) and (1) Rue Ring Cotter Pin (Item #4) on both sides, refer to Figure A and Figure C.



Latch Rod Assembly Installation

To install the Latch Rod Assembly (Item #2), first loosely install the Latch Rod Assy to either Latch Release Lever (Item #3 or #4) by using (2) 1/2"-13 Flange Nuts (Item #5). Insert the Latch Release Lever through the Latch Guide at the base of the Vertical Rail and over the Door's lower hinge. See Figure B.

Once positioned secure the front end of the Latch Rod Assy by to the Latch Assembly (Item #1) by using (1) 1/2" Flat Washer (Item #6) and (1) Rue Ring Cotter Pin (Item #7). See Figure C. Repeat the procedures for the other side.



Inlet Arm Assembly Installation

Position the Inlet Arm Assembly (Item #2) over the Chassis Frame Assembly's (Item #1) Base Frame Cross Support. See Figure A. Secure the Inlet Arm Assy by using (3) 3/8"-16 x 1" Carriage Bolts (Item #3), (3) 3/8"-16 Flange Nuts (Item #4) and (3) 3/8" Flat Washers (Item #5). Refer to Figure A.

Note: Some parts and part features have been hidden from view for visual clarity.



Swivel Inlet Assembly Installation

Position the Swivel Inlet Assembly (Item #1) and Foam Seal (Item #5) into the Blower Inlet, as shown in Figure B. Install the Swivel Inlet Assy into the Inlet Arm Assy (Item #2) by securing the Swivel Inlet Assy using (1) 3/8"-16 x 2" HHCS (Item #3) and (1) 3/8"-16 Flange Nut (Item #4), refer to Figure C.



Tongue Mount Bracket Installation

Position (1) Tongue Mount Bracket (Item #2) over and another under the Tongue Tube (Item #1). Align the bolt holes and secure the (2) Tongue Mount Brackets to the Tongue Tube by using (2) 1/2"-13 x 3.25" HHCS (Item #3) and (2) 1/2"-13 Ny-Flange Lock Nuts (Item #4). Refer to Figure A.

The Tongue Hitch Kit P#(A2404) is an option available for hitching your Trailer Vac to your Tractor, see Figure A.

Before installing the Tongue Hitch Kit, assemble the kit together by positioning the Top Tongue Plate (Item #1) over the Bottom Tongue Plate (Item #2) and aligning their bolt holes together. Refer to Figure A. Secure the (2) Plates together by using (1) 3/8"-16 x 3" Carriage Bolts (Item #3) and (2) 3/8"-16 Ny-Flange lock Nuts (Item #4).

To install the Tongue Hitch Kit, place the Tongue Hitch Kit over the Tongue Tube (Item #1) and align the bolt holes. Secure the Tongue Hitch Kit by using (2) 1/2"-13 x 3-1/4" HHCS (Item #2) and (2) 1/2"-13 Ny-Flange Lock Nuts (Item #3). Refer to Figure B.

The QuickPin No-Latch 2" Trailer Coupler (Item #1) is an option available for hitching your Trailer Vac to your Tractor, see Figure C.

To install the QuickPin Trailer Coupler (Item #1), place the Trailer Coupler over the Tongue Tube (Item #2) and align the bolt holes. Secure the Trailer Coupler by using (2) 1/2"-13 x 3-1/4" HHCS (Item #3) and (2) 1/2"-13 Ny-Flange Lock Nuts (Item #4). Refer to Figure C.

Position and align the bolt holes of the Engine Mount Assembly (Item #1) over the Engine Support Arm Assembly (Item #3). Then, affix the Engine Mount Assembly to the Engine Support Arm Assembly by using (2) 3/8"-16 x 3" HHCS (Item #5). Next, position the Engine Swing Arm Lockout Bracket (Item #2) over the Engine Mount Assy by aligning the bolt holes as shown in Figure A and moving it over the (2) 3/8"-16 x 3" HHCS. Estate Series Unit Instructions

<u>Note:</u> The Ball Clevis Assembly (Item #3) will need to be secured onto the rear of your tractor. This may require you to drill a hole in your bumper to procure the securement. You'll need to first position the Ball Clevis Assembly and mark where it'll best fit your tractor. An ideal location would be one easily accessible, clear of obstruction and will not affect the performance of your unit or tractor structurally or functionally.

To install the Ball Clevis Assembly, first, thread (1) 5/8"-11 Hex Nut (Item #2) onto the Adjusting Rod (Item #1) then place the Adjusting Rod into the Ball Clevis Assembly (Item #3). Place the Ball Clevis (Item #6) at the rear end of the Ball Clevis Assy. Then, secure the Ball Clevis by using (1) 3/8"-16 x 2-1/4" HHCS (Item #7) and (1) 3/8"-16 Nyloc Nut (Item #8), refer to the Figure below.

Next, secure the Ball Clevis Assy to the Engine Stay Plate by using (1) Hair Pin Clip (Item #4) and (1) 1/2" Flat Washer (Item #5).

Finally, secure the Ball Clevis to the rear of your tractor using (1) 3/8"-16 x 1" HHCS (Item #9) and (1) 3/8" Flat Washer (Item #10).

The Ball Clevis Assy can be positioned along the Engine Stay Plate to better secure the Engine Support Arm.

Position the (2) Engine Mount Swivel Adapters (Item #2) over the Swivel Base (Item #1) while aligning their mounting holes. Secure the Engine Mount Swivel Adapter by using (4) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" Carriage Bolts (Item #3) and (4) 5/16"-18 Ny-Flange Lock Nuts (Item #4). Refer to Figure A.

Rotating the Swivel Base (Item #1) by 45° will better position the mount holes for ease of installation. See Figure B.

Your Universal Battery Box (Item #1) will need to be assembled before installing the Universal Battery Kit P#(A2326).

First, make sure your bolt holes on each tab are aligned with the holes on the base body. Then secure the tabs to the body by using (4) 1/4"-20 x 1/2" HHCS (Item #2) and (4) 1/4"-20 Ny-Flange Lock Nuts (Item #3) on each tab. Refer to Figure A below.



Universal Battery Kit Installation (Cont.)

Position the Battery Box (Item #2) over the Rubber Shock Absorber (Item #5) and over the Swivel Adapter of the Tongue Tube, See Figure A. Secure the Battery Box by using (2) 5/16"-18 x 3/4" HHCS (Item #7) and (2) 5/16"-18 Ny-Flange Lock Nuts (item #8).

Next, place the Battery (Item #2) in the Battery Box and secure the Battery by using (1) Battery Clamp (Item #3), (2) 1/4"-20 x 4-1/2" Carriage Bolts (Item #5) and (2) 1/4"-20 Wing Nuts (Item #6). Be Sure the Battery Clamp is positioned between the battery's positive (+) and negative (-) terminal to prevent any possibility for the battery to arc. Refer to the Figures Below.

Next, Align the top and bottom Engine Swing Arm Lockout Brackets and finally, secure the (2) Engine Swing Arm Lockout Brackets together using the Hitch Pin Assembly (Item #1) and Hair Pin Cotter (Item #2). Wiring Harness Installation

To connect the Wiring Kit P#(A2152), connect the 4 gage Red Wire P#(P0620) to the positive (+) terminal of the starter solenoid on the engine. Route the Red Wire from the solenoid to the positive (+) terminal of the battery.

Connect the 4 gage Black Wire P#(P0621) to one of the mounting bolt holes located on the bottom of the engine. Route the black wire from the bolt hole to the negative (-) terminal of the battery.

Refer to the Figures below for your respective engine.

Once the wires are properly routed, test start the engine. If working properly, secure the wiring with the provided Zip Ties P#(J0245).



Wiring Harness Installation (Cont.)

To connect the Wiring Harness, connect the 10 gage Red Wire P#(P0278) from the positive (+) terminal of the starter solenoid located on the front end of the engine to the positive (+) terminal of the battery. Refer to the Figure below.

Then, connect the 10 gage Black Wire P#(P0279) from one of the mounting bolt holes located on the bottom of the engine or one of the bolt holes located on the Engine Mount Arm to the negative (-) terminal of the battery. Refer to the Figure below.





Jack Stand Assembly & Installation

The following procedure is the same for both Jack Stand configurations: P#(A2332) - Jack Stand Assy / Jack Foot or P#(A2333) - Jack Stand Assy / Caster Wheel.

First, install the A-Frame Jack (Item #2) to the top of the Jack Mount Bracket (Item #1) by using (3) 3/8"-16 x 1" Carriage Bolts (Item #4) and (3) 3/8"-16 Ny-Flange Lock Nuts (Item #5). Then install the Jack Caster Wheel (Item #3) to the A-Frame Jack. See Figure A.

Once the Jack is assembled to the Jack Mount Bracket, install the Left Mount Support Bracket (Item #2) to the Jack Mount Bracket by using (2) 3/8"-16 x 1" Carriage Bolts (Item #4) and (3) 3/8"-16 Ny-Flange Lock Nuts (Item #5). See Figure B. Repeat the same process for the Right Mount Support Bracket (Item #3).



Jack Stand Assembly & Installation (Cont.)

The Jack Mount Kit (Item #1) in Figure D is part of the Jack Stand Assy for both configurations previously mentioned, refer to page 29.

First, align the mount holes of the Jack Mount Kit (Item #1) to those located on the Base Frame Cross Support of the Base Frame Assembly. See Figure C & Figure D.

Install the Jack Stand Assy to the Base Frame Cross Support by using (2) 3/8"-16 x 1" Carriage Bolts (Item #2) and (2) 3/8"-16 Ny-Flange Lock Nuts (Item #3) on the top of the Jack Stand Assy and another set to the front of the Jack Stand Assy. Refer to Figure D below.

Impeller Blade Removal/Replacement

To Remove: First remove the 3/8"-24 x 1" GR8 HHCS P#(K0003) **(#1)**, 3/8" Double Indented Washer P#(K0284) **(#2)** and (1) Tapered Washer P#(K0277) **(#3)** from the Taper-Lock Bushing P#(S4302) **(#5)**. Next remove the (2) 1/4"-20 x 1" HHCS P#(K1225) **(#4)** and place them into the threaded holes of the Taper-Lock Bushing **(#5)**. Gradually thread each bolt evenly into the Taper-Lock Bushing, forcing the blade to break-away from the Taper-Lock Bushing. If the Impeller will not move, carefully hit the base of the Impeller, between each vein, with a hammer, then try again.

<u>To Replace</u>: Firstly, start by applying anti-seize to the 3/8"-24 x 1" GR8 HHCS (#1) and set it aside. Then, place the Impeller Blade over the engine shaft. Slide the Taper-Lock Bushing (#5) on to the engine shaft and into the Impeller Blade, aligning the **non-threaded** holes of the Taper-Lock Bushing to the threaded holes of the Impeller Blade. Fasten by using (2) 1/4"-20 x 1" HHCS (#4), (1) Tapered Washer (#3), (1) 3/8" Double Indented Washer (#2), and (1) 3/8"-24 x 1" GR8 HHCS (#1). Torque to the proper specifications in the torque chart on the back of this manual. Next, rotate the Impeller Blade to ensure that the blade is clear of contact on all sides of the blower housing.



Blower Cone Installation

Thread (1) 5/16"-18 Jam Nut P#(K0120) onto each end of (2) 5/16"-18 x 2-1/2" HHCS P#(K0125), refer to Figure A. Next, partially thread (1) bolt into each of the two threaded bosses located on the Blower Housing. Position the Blower Cone so the tabs line up with the bolts and tighten completely, refer to Figure B. Once the (2) bolts are tight, tighten the Jam Nuts against the threaded boss, refer to Figure C. See Figure D for proper Blower Cone installation.



Length Of Hose Adjustment

The hoses in the following steps must be cut to fit your machine. Do not cut the hoses until you have tried to fit them on your machine. Remember that the hoses need to be long enough to allow for the opening and closing of the collection system as well as allowing ample clamping surface between each component.

Upper Hose Installation

Slide a Hose Clamp P#(J0060) / P#(J0070) over one end of the 6" or 7"Upper Hose. Secure this end of the Upper Hose to the Blower Outlet. See Figure below for details. Secure opposite end of the Upper Hose to the Swivel Inlet. Make sure both ends are securely fastened by tightening the Hose Clamp.



Additional Instructions for Estate Series Units

Lower Hose To Blower Cone Installation

Slide a Hose Clamp P#(J0070) over both ends of the Lower Hose. Secure one end of the Lower Hose to the Blower Cone and fasten by tightening the Hose Clamp.

Lower Hose To Boot Installation

Take the unattached end of the Lower Hose and secure it to the circular end of the Boot and fasten by tightening the Hose Clamp.

Tip: Before securing Hose Clamp fully, rotate Lower Hose counter-clockwise (away from yourself) approximately 1" to aid in retaining Boot to mower deck.
Wand Kit Installation

Pasture Vac Unit Instructions

Install one end of the 6" Hose over the Blower Cone (Item #1) by using (1) 6" Hose Clamp (Item #2). Secure the other end over the Nose Cone of the Wand Kit by using (1) 6" Hose Clamp (Item #2). Refer to Figure A.

Once installed, the 6" Hose can be stored by wrapping it around the Hose Hanger (Item #3) as shown in Figure A.

SECTION III OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

General Safety

WARNING

Engine Blower Assembly MUST be completely TURNED OFF before checking and performing any maintenance. FAILURE TO DO SO MAY RESULT IN SERIOUS INJURY.

To turn the Engine Blower Assembly OFF, turn the key/switch on the Engine to the OFF position.

Only qualified people familiar with this operator's manual and the mower's operator's manual should operate this machine.

Operation & Tips On Mowing

- A. Perform BEFORE EACH USE the maintenance list referenced in Section IV.
- B. Start the engine/blower/blade assembly.
- C. Start mower.
- D. With the mower at high idle speed, engage the mower deck.
- E. Proceed to operate the control levers of the mower.

Note: If the collection system does not appear to be collecting the grass clippings; disengage the deck, turn off the engine blower assembly, engage the parking brake and turn the mower off. Check the upper hose, lower hose, top screen and boot for clogs.

To obtain the maximum effectiveness from your collection system the tips listed below should be followed:

- * Watch your speed- Normal conditions will allow a speed of up to approximately 5 mph, but thick, heavy damp conditions will require reduced ground speed.
- * Mow with sharp blades- A sharp blade cuts cleaner.
- * Wet grass and leaves will decrease effectiveness and will increase horsepower requirements.
- * Mow at higher cutting heights- Remove and mulch no more than 2" of grass length with each mowing. (Experts recommend not cutting off more than 1/3 of the grass blade length at any given time.)
- * Mow twice, at different height settings, (high, then low), if grass is extra tall.

* Remember that horsepower requirements will vary with the mowing conditions such as type and height of turf grass, moisture content, amount of leaves, whether the terrain is flat or hilly, etc.

Unloading The Collection System

NOTE: Collection system blower will have an audible change in tone when the collection system is full.

- A. Stop the forward movement of the mower.
- B. Disengage the mower deck.
- C. Adjust the throttle of the engine down to idle.
- D. Release the Latch Assembly using the Latch Handle at the side of the container.
- E. Loosen the Swivel Inlet from the container.
- F. Use the Handle Rail Assembly to tilt and rotate the container back. The container will then release its contents.
- G. Once the contents of the container have fallen out, the container is ready to move back into its normal operating position. With the handle in the 'open' position, lift the handle up until it completely latches and stops. This will place the container back into the collection position.

NOTE: Do not allow the container to become over-filled as potential damage may occur to your equipment.

SECTION IV MAINTENANCE

Maintenance Checklist

Before each use:

- 1. Check blades and spindles to be sure that no foreign objects, such as wire or steel strapping bands, are wrapped around them.
- 2. Inspect blades for wear. Replace if necessary. If it is necessary to sharpen the blades, remove the blades from the spindles before sharpening. DO NOT sharpen blades while still attached to the mower.
- Make sure all shields are in place and in good condition. Repair or replace any missing or damaged shields.
- 4. Listen for abnormal sounds, which might indicate loose parts, damaged bearings, or other damage. Correct any deficiency before continuing operation.

5.	Check for wear or deterioration of the upper or lower
	hoses. If there are any portions of the hose that have
	been torn or worn through, replace with genuine
	PECO parts.

SECTION V PARTS & SERVICE

After Each Use:

- 1. Clean all debris from machine especially from the container, and off of safety decals. Replace any missing or illegible decals.
- 2. Clean all debris from the container screen.
- Inspect unit for worn or damaged components. Repair or replace before the next use. Any replacement component installed during repair shall include the components current safety decal specified by the manufacturers to be affixed to the component.

Parts And Service Information

Collection system owners should record the name and telephone number of their Service Center. Your Service Center will be happy to supply replacement parts, accessories, and do any service or repairs to your collection system. If for any reason your Service Center is unable to service your collection system or supply replacement parts, contact New PECO, Inc. and include the following information on the chart below.
